# Overview and Immediate Relief Efforts

In August 2022, unprecedented floods in Pakistan, triggered by heavy monsoon rains, devastated communities, leading to the destruction of numerous villages and leaving almost 10 million children in urgent need of assistance. The floods affected millions across all four provinces, destroying 897,014 houses and damaging an additional 1,391,467. Public health facilities, water systems, and schools were also severely impacted. At least 1,739 people, including 647 children and 114 women, lost their lives. The aftermath included injuries, waterborne diseases, and contaminated water sources, posing significant challenges for displaced families seeking shelter and basic necessities.

## **First Phase - Immediate Relief Efforts:**

Our initial response focused on providing essential aid to meet the immediate needs of the flood-affected population. We distributed essential items such as food, water, tents, mosquito nets, and medicines, and deployed medical teams to address health concerns.

## **Second Phase - Build a Home:**

Thanks to your generous donation of US\$ 300,000, we have completed 273 homes, providing shelters to flood-affected families.

## **Third Phase - Economic Upliftment:**

We have supported 1162 families through your donation of US\$ 375,000.00. This support included not only financial assistance but also proper counseling and guidance for sustainable economic models, such as setting up small-scale shops, livestock, and agriculture farming.





## BENEFICIARY STORY- ZAHIDA BIBI

### **Resident of Village Kotla Nasir, District Rajapur, Punjab:**

Zahida Bibi, a resilient widow from Village Kotla Nasir, was left to raise her three young daughters after her husband passed away due to a sudden heart attack. With no source of income and no male guardian, she relied on stitching clothes for neighbors to survive. Life was already a daily struggle when the devastating floods swept through their village, destroying what little they had – including their one-room mud house. Homeless and vulnerable, Zahida feared for her children's future. That's when WF-AID and partners intervened. Through the generous support of donors, her family was provided with a room and washroom. Zahida now continues her stitching work from home, and her daughters have resumed school. "We were drowning, and you pulled us out," she says tearfully.

## BENEFICIARY STORY - MOHAMMAD ALI

### **Resident of Village Basti Lashari, District Layyah, Punjab:**

Mohammad Ali, a young father of two, once earned a modest living as a motorbike mechanic. His shop, built with years of effort, was washed away in the floods that ravaged his village in Layyah. Left with nothing but the clothes on their backs, his family took shelter under a makeshift plastic sheet. With no roof over their heads and no tools to earn a living, Mohammad faced despair. Then came a ray of hope — WF-AID, through its flood rehabilitation efforts, constructed a room and a washroom for Mohammad's family. They also helped him acquire basic tools to restart his workshop. Today, Mohammad works again with pride, slowly rebuilding what he lost. "Your support lit a fire of courage in me. I will never forget this," he says with heartfelt gratitude.
